# TEAM UP with the City to beautify our town & make it safer at the same time!

As you stroll through town, we're sure you have noticed that many sidewalks were installed in 1912. That is over 100 years! Concrete seems to last a lifetime...however, it doesn't always stay in the best condition.

When salt, or even "concrete safe" products are used, it creates spalling (areas of concrete which have cracked & delaminated from the substrate) and other defects. Trees planted along the boulevards have heaved up the concrete creating huge trip hazards. Just over time, they lose quality.

# Well, did you know the City will help pay for Sidewalk Replacement?





### Do your sidewalks look like the above?

The City is committed to the replacement of deteriorated and/or trip hazard sidewalks by tearing out and hauling away the debris as our contribution to your sidewalk replacement project. Concrete is heavy and this saves you the cost of labor to remove and the disposal fee at the landfill.




The City will also provide the American with Disabilities Act (ADA) corner tiles.

This is approximately a \$400 expense, so ultimately a savings to you!

TIP - A SAFE SIDEWALK is the best defense in hazard prevention.



Inclement weather, such as rain and snow, increase the risk of trip, slip & fall. Shoveling is the best way to keep the sidwalks in great condition.
